**F**almouth Historical Society and its Museums sit on two acres overlooking the Village Green, where members of the Colonial militia practiced in the 1700s. Two 18th-century houses display furniture and fine art, toys and textiles, through which we see how the townspeople lived over the centuries. Special exhibits tell of Falmouth's 19th-century whaling industry and the art of pre-Civil War medicine. (You'll be happy you live today!).

The Visitors Center and Museum Store are located in the Hallett Barn, a welcoming place filled with interactive games and a special exhibit about Katharine Lee Bates, author of *America the Beautiful*. The Barn is wheelchair-accessible.

Members of the **Falmouth Garden Club** maintain three delightful gardens on the grounds. Visitors are welcome to stroll or relax in the gardens during daylight hours year-round.
